PACKHORSE BRIDGE WEST RASEN

The West Rasen Packhorse Bridge was built around 1310 by Bishop John Dalderby (Bishop of Lincoln 1300 to 1320). Packhorses were the main mode of transport for carrying goods throughout the Middle Ages. Few packhorse bridges remain today with only three in Lincolnshire. One at Utterby near Louth and at Screddington near Sleaford.
