WALKING

Nestled on the picturesque hillside at the northern edge of the Lincolnshire Wolds, Caistor is known for its charming Georgian architecture and rich history dating back to Roman times. Come and explore the genuine beauty and historical significance of Caistor.



THE VIKING WAY

The Viking Way spans 149 miles, starting in Barton Upon Humber (North Lincolnshire) and finishing in Oakham (Rutland). This scenic trail

winds through the picturesque landscape of the Lincolnshire Wolds, passing through Caistor.

HERITAGE

Discover the town's fascinating history through the Caistor Walkabout Trail. It's approximately 0.6 miles and guides visitors to see sites that are part of the town's heritage.

As you wander, look out for small round blue plaques that can be found on various buildings. These give a fascinating insight to the diverse history of the town.

IN ORE OF OUR PAST

Just a five-minute drive away is the village of Nettleton, which until just a few decades ago was one of the most industrious parts of the Wolds. Today the Nettleton Valley is a grassy, peaceful picturesque place, and from the top there are fine views towards the River Trent and Lincoln.

Distance: 4.5 miles (7.2km)

Elevation: 495ft

Time: 2 to 2.5 hours

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CYCLE ROUTES

Explore the area on two wheels with two routes designed by Cycle Lincolnshire! Enjoy magnificent views, interesting towns and quaint villages as you ride through the Lincolnshire Wolds and surrounding Lincolnshire countryside.

- 1 Market Rasen to Caistor (33.5 miles / 54km)
Can be done in reverse.
- 2 The Wolds' Challenge (80 miles / 129km)
Passes near Caistor at Nettleton.
